# Erasmus+ project 2018-2020 Stop Climate Change – Together Europe Achieves More 2018-1-HR01-KA229-047516

## **Final Survey Results Report**

### **Introduction**

In spring 2020 students, parents and teachers were asked to fill out a questionnaire which was part of the Erasmus project 'Stop climate change'. We wanted to see if project activities resulted in raised awareness of the importance to mitigate climate changes and readiness of pupils, parents and teachers to take part in activities and change their lifestyle. 248 people met this request and below you can find a report with the most important findings.

This report will be shared among the respondents and other people who are interested in this project. The outcomes will be used to develop learning aids for students.

#### **Respondents**

Survey was filled by 130 pupils, 74 parents and 45 teachers from all partner countries. Most pupils (127) are 12-16 years old, only 3 are older.

#### **Questions:**

Respondents were offered statements and possibilities to indicate how much they agree with them: agree strongly, agree, neither agree nor disagree, disagree, disagree completely.

Most respondents claim that they learned a lot about climate changes (146 agree strongly and 96 agree).

They also realized that all European countries will experience negative effects of climate change, effects that will be harmful for our health (145 agree strongly. 99 agree).

Most respondents feel a moral duty to do something (150 strongly agree, 92 agree9 and are ready to take personal sacrifices for the sake of the environment (135 agree strongly and 99 agree).

The majority of respondents have already taken actions aimed at helping to fight climate changes (121 agree strongly, 111 agree).

Public transport is a problem in some regions and it is the reason why 9 respondents haven't started using public transport more often.

The opinion of the majority of respondents is that all countries must start using renewable sources of energy as soon as possible (172 agree strongly, 74 agree).

The statement "It is not too late to mitigate global warming." had following responses: agree strongly – 110 agree – 81 neither agree nor disagree – 55 disagree – 2 disagree strongly – 3 We can conclude that a significant number of respondents is not sure that governments and industry will do their part in mitigating global warming.

The statement about feelings towards climate changes enabled multiple choice of answers and it showed that most respondents feel HOPEFUL (159), but they are also SAD (48), FEARFUL/AFRAID (70), ANGRY (40) and POWERLESS (32).
